VISITING CHOIR

There is a first time for everyone in the choir. Before becoming a member, each individual was first a visitor. Choir visitors are our most honored and cherished guests, and we strive to make every visitor's experience the finest. Visitor check-in is open each Wednesday from 6-6:30PM.

ATTENDANCE

Visitors must attend four consecutive rehearsals from 6:30-8:30PM to be eligible for audition at the end of the fourth rehearsal.

WHAT TO EXPECT

WEEK 1 – First-time visitors check in with our First Impressions Team (FIT), where they receive music, have their photo taken, are introduced to the choir, and meet personally with Pastor Brooks.

WEEKS 2-4 – Returning visitors check in with FIT and attend rehearsal. After the completion of the fourth consecutive visit, an invitation will be extended to complete a vocal interview with Pastor Rodney. The interview consists of three components:

- 1) Sing a song of your choice with or without accompaniment.
- 2) Sing through a series of vocal scales to determine range.
- 3) Q&A with Pastor Rodney.

Upon successful completion of the vocal interview, new members will begin the four-week onboarding process. Members are also eligible to join the choir in the loft for the Sunday 9:30AM service.



RELATIONSHIPS MATTER

PHILIPPIANS 2:4

*Do not merely look out for your own personal interests,
but also for the interest of others.*

Being part of the Woodway Worship Choir affords choir members many friendships. Two of the most important relationships for a choir member are their Mentor and Care Group Leader.

MENTOR

Mentors manage new choir member orientation after a choir visitor passes their vocal interview. Mentors make the transition into choir easy by making sure the new member receives a warm welcome and experiences a smooth and successful onboarding process. A Mentor will be a new member's closest friend in choir who will provide a 4-week orientation of how choir works.

CARE GROUP LEADER

To account for each of our members and minister to the various needs of our choir, we have implemented a Care Group Leader program. This program enables us to care for our members individually and collectively through contact, prayer, and encouragement. Our choir is subdivided into groups by voice parts, and a Care Group Leader will manage a small group of members including themselves. It is the responsibility of both the Care Group Leader and member to stay in touch with each other in the event of an absence from service or rehearsal as well as sickness, bereavement, or other needs. **It's a two-way street!** If a choir member is unable to attend a rehearsal or service, they need to contact their Care Group Leader as soon as possible. The Care Group Leader is responsible for reporting the choir member's attendance and will need information about the member's absence to maintain accurate attendance records. This allows Pastor Brooks to stay informed about each choir member.

WEDNESDAY

Large group rehearsals take place each Wednesday night from 6:30–8:30PM in the Adult Choir Room, located on the second floor of the E Building. Choir members are expected to attend and rehearse the full two-hour period. Rehearsal check-in begins at 5:30PM.

The monitor located in the Adult Choir Room will display the evening's rehearsal order of music as well as any other pertinent information regarding rehearsal and the weekend worship service. This schedule is also shared on our Woodway Worship Ministry Facebook page.

*A note for your convenience: Dinner is served each Wednesday from 4:45–6:15PM in the Fellowship Hall. Meal prices start at \$5. It's a great way to meet other choir members and establish relationships.


SUNDAY

SPECIAL REHEARSALS

From time to time, special rehearsals are announced by Pastor Brooks on an as-needed basis. These are required rehearsals for participation in special programs and events.



MINISTRY TO MINORS (CHILDCARE)

Sunday and Wednesday Night programming are available for minors during the Worship service and Bible Study hours:

- Preschool (Children 6 weeks - Pre-K)
- Children (Kindergarten - Grade 5)
- JHigh (Grades 6-8)
- High School (Grades 9-12)

Childcare for children in 5th grade and under is by reservation only. For more specific information, contact the Woodway Worship & Arts Office to confirm specific childcare needs. Please note that Wednesday night childcare closes promptly at 8:30PM. Parents will need to slip out of the adult choir room by 8:15 in order to respect this deadline.

Event Care is available on Wednesday nights during choir and orchestra rehearsals for Preschool through 5th Grade.

SUNDAY ETIQUETTE

CHOIR LOFT

- While in the choir loft, refrain from talking, laughing and/or waving.
- Services are live streamed. Be sure to smile, always watch Pastor Brooks, know the music, and do not look at the IMAG screens during featured choir specials.
- At the conclusion of services, the choir will exit the loft by row, moving up the stairs. Please DO NOT exit the loft by walking down the loft stairs and across the stage.



MUSIC

Since we strongly encourage personal preparation outside our scheduled rehearsal times, members have several ways to access the printed music as well as MP3 audio files. Choir members can choose to use print or digital music for rehearsal purposes.

PRINT MUSIC OPTION WITH MUSIC FOLDER

- Should a member choose to use print music, a numbered music folder will be assigned. This folder will stay with the member and should be taken home each week after rehearsal. Members are responsible for managing the pieces contained in the folder.
- At check in each Wednesday night, new rehearsal music can be picked up from the member's assigned folder "mail slot" located near the rehearsal check in station. Members will want to organize their folder prior to the beginning of rehearsal at 6:30.
- Members will also return pieces that are no longer on the schedule. The titles to be returned will be communicated weekly and return baskets will be located near the check in station.

**If a folder is lost, the member is responsible for the replacement costs of the folder and its contents.*



DIGITAL MUSIC USING YOUR TABLET DEVICE AND THE MUSIC STAND APP (FROM PLANNING CENTER)

- Members choosing to use digital music files will download the Music Stand from Planning Center App on their personal mobile device or tablet.
- For initial log in information, contact Magen Stone at mlstone@second.org or Laurie Foster at lfoster@second.org.
- Once logged into the app, members will be able to access the following plans:
 - Rehearsal CDs- compilations of songs that are currently in the worship special rotation.
 - Sunday 9:30- a complete list of the titles to be used for a specific worship service.
 - Wednesday Choir Rehearsal- a complete list of titles to be rehearsed, in rehearsal order.
 - A PowerPoint training guide is available to you should you choose to “go digital”. The worship office is also always available to answer questions and help guide you through the process.


**Please note that “in-house” custom arrangements will not always have a recording of the song available.*


REHEARSAL CDS

- Periodically, the Woodway Worship office will provide rehearsal CDs. Rehearsal CDs will also be made available for special events and holiday performances.
- Rehearsal CDs contain demos of the special selections planned for that particular quarter and/or special event.
- Every Rehearsal CD is also accessible and free of charge to choir members digitally using Music Stand by Planning Center app.
- Both the rehearsal CD and Music Stand App are great resources for your personal preparation and rehearsal.

ATTENDANCE STANDARDS

I CORINTHIANS 4:2

Moreover it is required in stewards that one be found faithful.

Attendance matters. For our choir to deliver the best possible offering to the Lord in song, we must practice diligence in our attendance at rehearsals and services. It is a requirement that choir members maintain a minimum attendance of 70 percent in a given 10-week period. This means a choir member must maintain seven out of 10 Wednesday evening rehearsals and seven out of 10 Sunday Worship services to maintain choir membership. At the end of each 10-week period, choir members receive their attendance for the period.

CHECK-IN

Because we maintain attendance records and send attendance letters to choir members at the end of every 10-week period, choir members need to check in each Sunday and Wednesday upon arrival to choir. Members, simply stop at the kiosk and swipe your fob or enter your name. If you do not have a key fob, please let us know on a Wednesday night and one will be issued to you.



ABSENCES

Choir members who miss a rehearsal or worship service should communicate directly with their Care Group leader. Should the reason for absence include a ministry or prayer need, the Care Group leader will alert the Member Care team.

The four types of absences are:

Excused: These type of absences include work or mission trips and do not count against attendance in a 10-week period.

Non-Excused: These types of absences are non-work related and count against attendance during a 10-week period.

Leave of Absence: An LOA involves an absence that extends from 4-8 weeks and available to members in good standing who have been part of the choir for a year or more.

- 1) Health
- 2) Maternity Leave
- 3) School-related conflicts
- 4) Work-related conflicts

Care Group Leaders will be able to share the digital LOA request with members as needed. Once the form is submitted, it will be reviewed by the WWC president and approved or denied. Members returning from an approved LOA need not re-audition and can join the choir in the loft after attending two rehearsals. Members whose requests are not approved will be placed on the inactive roster.

Absent Without Leave: If a choir member is absent four consecutive weeks without leave, explanation, or failure to communicate, their membership will be changed to inactive and removed from the active choir membership roster. A letter to this effect will be sent to the member from the Choir President.

RETURNING MEMBERS

If a choir member must take an extended leave from choir, we welcome that choir member to return when they can meet the attendance standards. If a returning member has been gone from choir less than one year, they must complete two consecutive visits to choir before being reinstated to choir. If a returning member has been gone from choir more than one year, they must complete four consecutive visits to choir and vocal interview again before being reinstated to choir.

WORSHIP SERVICES

- On designated Sundays, the choir will wear the WWC uniform.
 - **Women**- black jacket with pointed hemline, red/blue reversible shell paired with long black slacks provided by the choir member. Uniforms should be worn with dark or black dress shoes and minimal jewelry. The jacket and shell can be purchased for the worship office.
 - **Men**- black long-sleeved dress shirt with red or blue tie paired with a men's black suit provided by the choir member. The dress shirt and two ties can be purchased through the worship office. Uniforms should be worn with black dress shoes.
- WWC formal wear is worn on special occasions.
- When the Woodway Worship Choir outfit is not worn, a specific color palette and modesty guidelines will be communicated to the choir members posted on the webpage and on the loft sign up.

Special Note for choir members in the loft – Members should not wear large earrings, hair ornaments, necklaces, facial piercings or adornment. Members should avoid using fragrances and perfumes during rehearsals and performances as these can often trigger allergy symptoms and be problematic for other singers.
